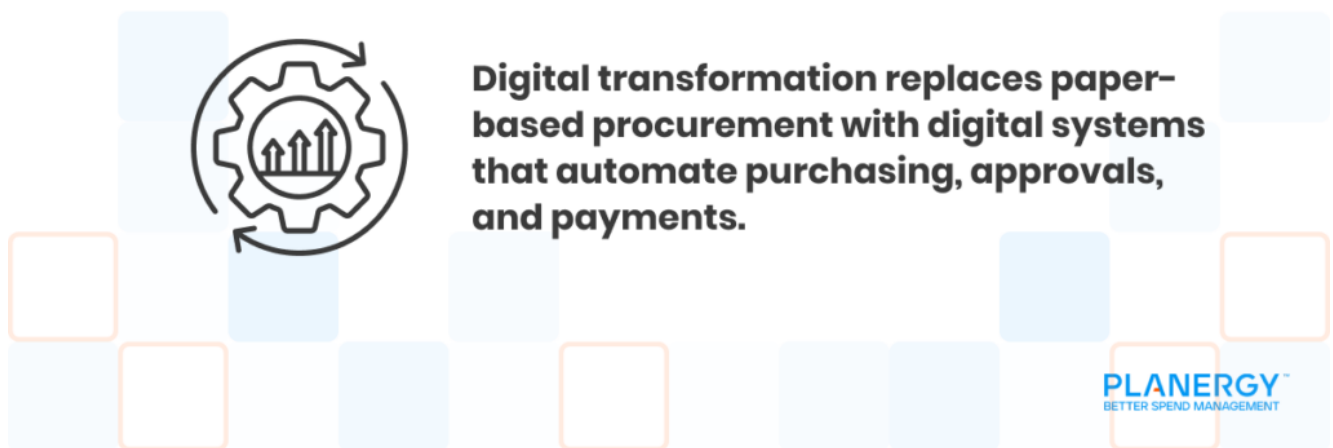

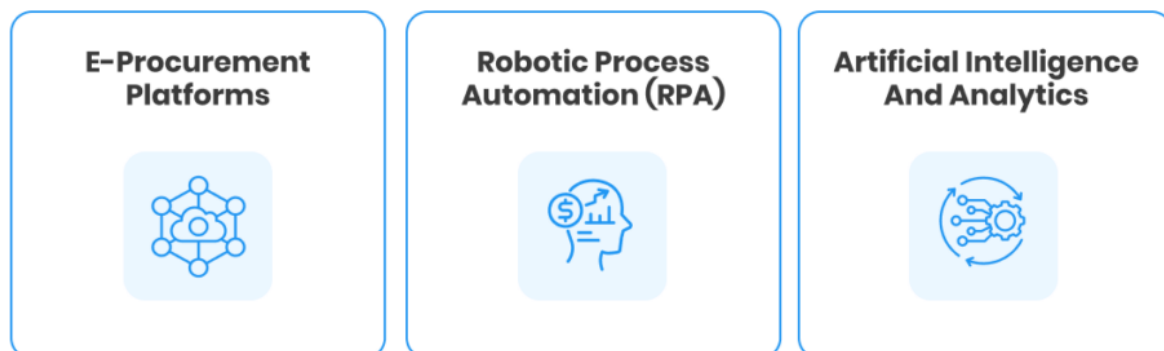

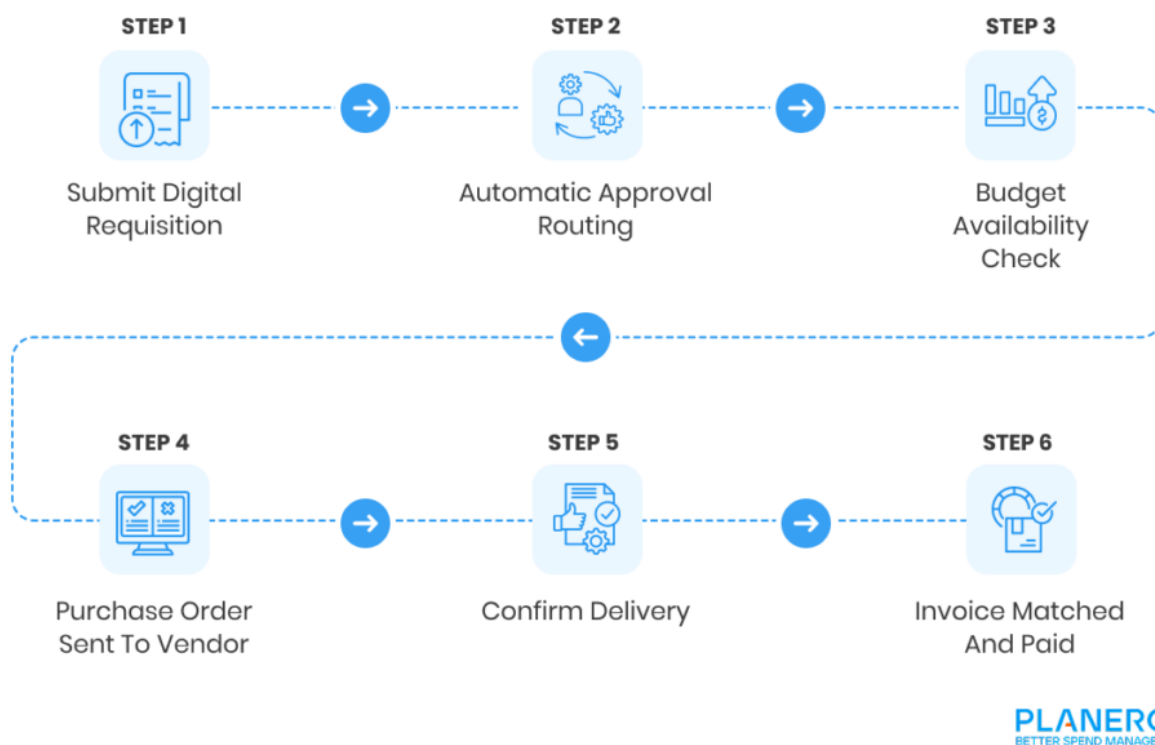
Automated Workflows

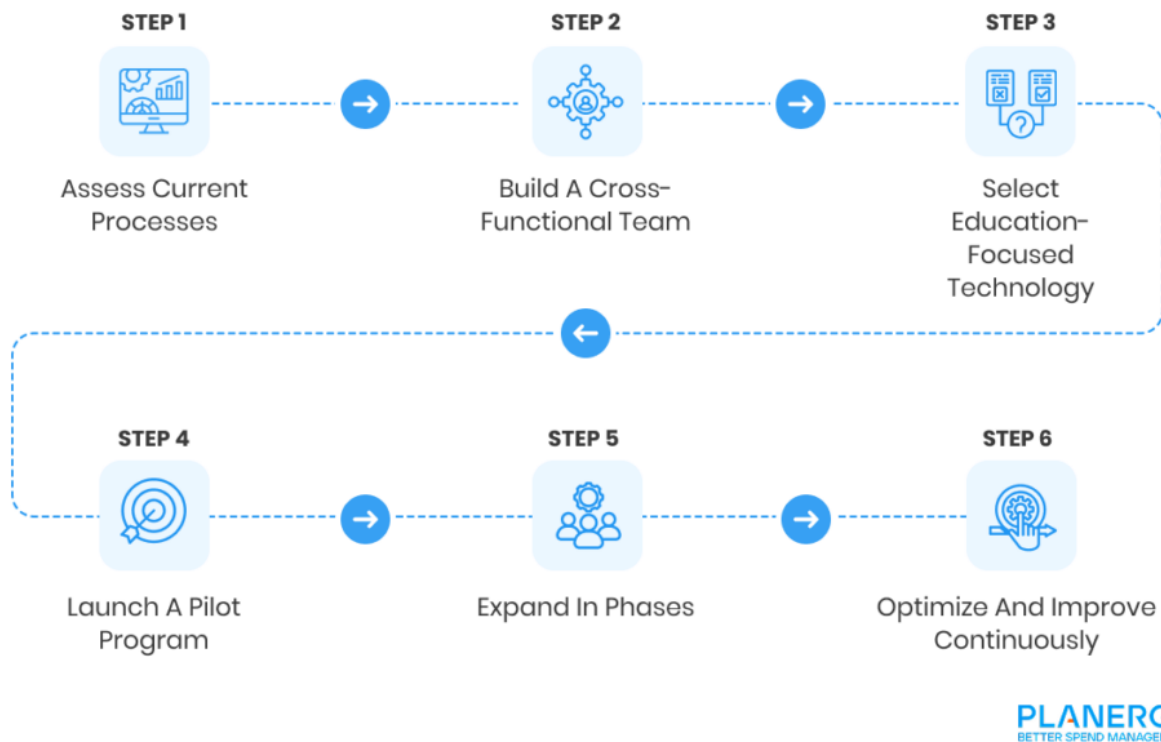
Steps to Successful Digital Transformation
